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MOVIE THEATERS ARE OPEN FOR BUSINESS! What Summer Blockbusters Should You Watch....




Summer is here and that means the return of summer blockbuster movies. It feels a little weird to say that after the past year. 2020 was not kind to the movie theater industry. I don't think there's ever been a time when we didn't go see a movie in the summer. Even during the Great Depression people could still go to movie theaters even if they could not afford it. Finally being back to movies in an actual theater is a sigh of relief to say the least, But we all know that it's going to take a while to get back to normal. A lot of the movies we expected to be released have still been pushed back to the fall of 2021. Shouldn't we have seen the latest James Bond installment by now. How many of you were looking forward to seeing the sequel to Top Gun? It's been a slow process getting back to the theater. After months of Covid-19 protocols where social distancing and masked mandates were still in full effect. as of June 1st, according to CDC guidelines, if you have been vaccinated then you can return to the movie theater, the same as you did before the pandemic.

It's safe to say that some people are still apprehensive, but we are starting to see a rise in going back to the movie theaters which means we finally get to enjoy summer blockbuster movies, at least a few of them. In 2020 revenue at movie theaters fell 80% from the year past. Only renting movies on demand through a theater seem to keep the industry alive. Between 2016 to 2019 theater revenues were just a little over \$10 billion upwards to 12 billion. Right now, what we are seeing is anywhere between 4.5 billion to 6 billion in revenues. The kind of revenues that you would see 40 years ago when Raiders of the Lost ark or E.T. The Extraterrestrial was released. However, slowly but surely, we are getting back. All major theater movie chains have relinquished their mask mandates. AMC theaters was the first to do it followed by Cinemark and Regal theaters.

When the Alamo Drafthouse returns later this summer, it will do the same. But as movie goers go back to the theater, the biggest question looming is what to see. In a lot of ways, it's still very much as a lackluster year for movies, but far from the drastic change that happened last year when all of a sudden we couldn't go to a theater to see a movie. Only a third of movies that we would normally see during the summer have been released and very few are getting released in July and August. The two biggest movies coming out over the next couple of months is Marvel's Black widow which is finally being released after a year and WarnerMedia's Suicide squad 2. Of course, Space Jam 2 is finally getting released, but that doesn't really feel like a summer blockbuster movie where one that people will rush out to theaters to see when they can see it on HBO Max the day it releases. So here at That Nerd Show, we offer you a nerd's opinion on what movies you should see and why. Check out our reviews for all the major releases as you decide what movies to see in the theater this summer. It may not be like in years past and it may be years before we get back to normal when it comes to summer blockbusters, but there are quite a few good ones that are worth going to see.

Cruella by Chloe James



While many know me as a Disnerd when it comes to Disney's animated feature length films (or the "Disney

Canon", as they like you to call them), I've been skeptical, to say the least, when it comes to the live action remakes. I'll be the first to admit, many of them have been surprisingly good. Some ... eh ... at least I'm reminded through them how much I like the original animated film. The bar for me was set low to begin with, in my great annoyance with the film Maleficent. I'll try not to get into details about why that movie really didn't work for me, but it boils down to how needless it is to ruin such a perfectly evil villain by giving her a sympathetic alternative backstory. Fast forward eight years later, and I'm really hoping Cruella convinces me to give the same concept another chance. The film follows Estella Miller (Emma Stone), a child with a wild side whom she desperately tries and fails to control, in her journey into becoming the character we all know, Cruella de Vil. We see her, as a child, meet her two rapscallions that would grow up to be her trusted lackeys, Horace (Paul Walter Hauser) and Jasper (Joel Fry). As she grows up, she turns to crime using her skills of fashion to create their disguises. Now, as an adult, she gets a job at the best clothing store in the city to try to

enter into the fashion industry from the ground floor, which is literal as she is scrubbing basement floors. She gets the attention of the Baroness (Emma Thompson), a world famous designer, by getting drunk one night and making a window display in a style that we can only classify as Cruella. While working for the Baroness, Estella starts to go behind her back and start stealing a new prize, the public's attention with the help of her old school friend, Anita Darling (Kirby Howell-Baptiste). The film also stars Emily Beecham as Estella's Mother, Kayvan Novak as Roger Dearly, and Mark Strong as John, the Baroness' valet. Cruella was directed by Craig Gillespie (Lars and the Real Girl; I, Tonya) and written by Dana Fox (Couples Retreat) and Tony McNamara (The Favourite). I have to mention the cinematopher, Nicolas Karakatsanis (The Drop; The Loft; I, Tonya) because there were so many beautifully shot scenes. For example, there was an extremely fast tracking long shot when they showed off the clothing store. It was only a minute long and it was stitched together, but it seamlessly transitions from a crane shot to a steadicam walking extremely fast through the large building.

And we can't talk about this movie without mentioning the most important part, the fashion. They got the legendary costume designer, Jenny Beavan (A Room with a View, Sense and Sensibility, Gosford Park, Mad Max: Fury Road), to create the elaborate costumes that serve as the main theme of the film. She had to design a total of 277 different costumes for the film, and 47 for Cruella de Vil alone, and each one is better than the last. She already has two Oscars under her belt, but I can already say that she's a frontrunner this year for her third. Something elsewhere deserves special mention in this film is the fact it has one of the most awesome soundtracks I've heard in years. Featuring dozens of iconic songs from the era (totaling in a soundtrack budget I'm sure only Disney could afford) the music became a

character in itself. I can go on for quite a while about how, on a technical level, Cruella deserves very high scores. However, I wanted to give it as much credit as I could before I get into the bad. Unfortunately, the "bad" in this film is enough to outweigh the good. Disney attempted to make a compelling story in which we, the audience can sit for two and a half hours and relate and empathize with a villain who we all know later kidnaps and attempts to murder puppies. And to their credit, they did their best. But the writing of this movie was just all over the place. I'm doing my best to give this review without spoiling much, but I'm not sure if Disney knew exactly what they wanted this movie to be. Is it a literal canon prequel that takes place before the animated feature we all know so well? Is it a completely sympathetic "alternative" look into a misunderstood villain's origin story?

Perhaps with some of the more "grey morality" villains (and very competent writers) both could be achieved at once. Cruella de Vil. however, is such an extreme villain in the canon Disney film, that the writers really needed to choose one path or another. Yet, it appears they couldn't decide and chose both. The result feels completely inconsistent in its overall message. Maleficent may have annoyed me in its overall concept and execution, but by the end of that film, at least I could say I understood what they were aiming for. Cruella may not have convinced me to change my mind about Disney villain origin story films, but I won't tell you to avoid watching it, either. I can honestly say it's very fun, visually pleasing, and entertaining, albeit drags on a bit long. I just have to emphasize to any fellow Disnerds out there, if you want any consistency with the original source material, leave your expectations at the door.

The great thing about any musical that gets turned into a film is you're able to do more with your set and I think the best part about this film is it really showcases the neighborhood of Washington Heights in New York. But what this film as well as the stage musical really is a love letter to the neighborhood that Lin-Manuel Miranda grew up in. I'm not saying that it's a bad thing, but this is also the same kind of story that can be told in any community. I very much like the film. As a fan of musicals, I am always a little picky when they try to transform a great musical into a movie, sometimes it's hit or miss and then sometimes they surprise you. In The Heights is a great representation of the stage musical, much like how the movie West Side Story was a great representation of its stage musical. From the sets to the atmosphere, you feel like you are in Washington Heights, so on that note they did a great job.

The cast does an incredible job with the music and you are for the most part transported into the stage musical Itself. The choreography is phenomenal and I think in a lot of ways are able to do more with it with actually being on a film set compared to being on a stage even though it may not be as intimate. But what really makes this film great to watch is if you don't know anything about the Washington Heights neighborhood and how it is a true melting pot of Dominican Republican Immigrants along with Irish and African-American, you really feel like that you are there and you understand their everyday problems. But this film isn't perfect just like the stage musical isn't perfect.

This is where I have my criticism of the story and don't get me wrong, I am not saying don't watch it, if you're a fan of musicals then it is a must see, but it is also predictable. I don't know if there really is anything original about this story except to the people who are from Washington Heights, like I said it's a great love letter to that neighborhood and it's great to have a musical showcase that. However, this is still a story that can be told in any poor neighborhood in any city where the true essence of that neighborhood is the community that faces the same struggles and sticks together. The problems the characters face aren't original. The only thing original to this musical and the movie is the music itself and the neighborhood for which it is set in. There are a lot of familiar tropes in this, but it doesn't take away from the performances of the cast or the music itself. And when it comes to Lin-Manuel Miranda, pretty much anything he is going to do is going to be great. I mean it's hard enough taking over a chimney sweeper character that was originally played by Dick Van Dyke in the original Mary Poppins, but Lin-Manuel Miranda almost did it flawlessly in Mary Poppins Returns. What I am saying is this story and the film itself seem very familiar and you may get a sense that you've seen this story before, but then again maybe that's okay because isn't West Side story really just Romeo and Juliet with poor immigrants in a New York neighborhood!

And, that's why I won't say this is a horrible film, but it also can't be a fantastic film at the same time. If you love Lin -Manuel Miranda and anything he does, then check out In The Heights. If you love musicals, then watch this film because really the best part and the heart of this story is him showing you where he came from and why this neighborhood represents pretty much any poor, but thriving community in America. It can very easily be the Treme neighborhood in New Orleans. The movie may not be perfect, and it may not be original, but that doesn't mean you won't enjoy it. It's worth checking out! And the mark of any great music is music that gets stuck in your head, which will easily happen when you watch In the Heights.

12 Mighty Orphans by Alex Moore



I was born and raised in the Dallas-Fort Worth area. Sooner or later, you find out about the game of football. What you also find out is that football, in the state of Texas, is more than just a game for

many, many people around these parts. For me, it was not my early exposure to the Dallas Cowboys of the NFL that drove home this point. In actuality, it was my time that I have spent as a play-byplay that made me realize just how significant the game truly is. Having been around, I have seen so much variety. Not just in the stadiums, whether they be modern or vintage, but in the general vibe the fans bring with them. Some venues and towns are more special than others, though I will not go into which ones, specifically. Having said that, part of what sets the tone is the history behind each place and when I think about that, the history is what truly makes a difference in the feeling and the experience. As time has gone by, there is more and more history for all of us to dig into. So where does that leave us when it comes to high school Texas football?...

Author Jim Dent once wrote a nonfiction book about a team of orphans in the Fort Worth area that came to prominence in a surprising way. It has now been adapted into a new sports movie, "12 Mighty Orphans." The film was directed by Ty Roberts, who also cowrote the screenplay with Kevin Meyer and Lane Garrison (who also plays as the character of Luther in the movie). Heading the cast is Luke Wilson ("All the Bright Places") as Rusty Russell, the head coach of the Masonic Home and School. Just as a side note, if you enjoy the spread offense, you have this man to thank for developing it. I think it should be noted that although Russell was greatly successful coaching at the high school level, he did not fair nearly as well at the collegiate level, though he certainly tried, but I digress... Rounding out the rest of the primary cast is: Vinessa Shaw ("The Blazing World") as Juanita Russell, Wayne Knight ("The Very Excellent Mr. Dundee") as Frank Wynn- the antagonist of the movie, if you will, and bit of a typecast for the actor, Jake Austin Walker ("No One Lives") as Hardy Brown – a youngster who is new to the school and stands out immediately as a special football player

immediately as a special football player (and did actually play in the NFL throughout the 1950s), Jack Lofland ("Maze Runner: The Death Cure") as Snoggs, Levi Dylan as Fairbanks, Robert Duvall ("Widows") as Mason Hawk and Martin Sheen ("Judas and the Black Messiah") as Doc Hall (and is also the film's narrator). Right off the bat, while I think almost everyone enjoys the work of Sheen as a narrator, I do not think it was really necessary for this particular movie. However, I cannot fault the filmmakers for including that little detail. After all, it is a story based on a true tale from the 1930s. I was quickly reminded of the basic story premise of movies like 1986's "Hoosiers," except that this is in Texas and has to be about football, right? The aspect I found that I enjoyed the most was the dialogue, which is quick and sharp. Wilson and Sheen seem to have a good on-screen chemistry within the context of their interactions in the story. The flow of the story, as is typical these days, is fast-paced and that might explain why so much of the true story was condensed in a way that makes it inaccurate.

In fact, Coach Russell did not come around to the Masonic Home and School during the height of The Great Depression. He actually moved his family out there in the late 1920s and was there until the early '40s, when he transferred his coaching job to Highland Park, in Dallas, but let us move on... I believe that most audience members are going to enjoy this film for what it is: inspirational and uplifting, but full of the expected and predictable cliches and tropes familiar to the sub-genre. The acting and production quality and writing style are its strengths and they should combine to give most people enough to feel satisfied. However... As much as I wanted to root for this movie, I was turned off by the flawed story-telling aspects and overwhelming examples of historical inaccuracies. I realize that most movies cannot be expected to stay on cue with all aspects of a true story, but I would have appreciated a bit more authenticity. That might just be my nitpicky sports broadcaster brain doing the talking, though. I am willing to concede that much, at least. Overall, I would still say that "12 Mighty Orphans" is more of a positive experience than a negative one. I simply cannot forget my sentimental Texas high school football connections enough to not recommend this film.

Hitman's Wife's Bodyguard by Marcus Blake



Does every movie really need a sequel? Pretty much any movie that is at least a little bit successful at the box office will get a sequel, that doesn't mean it needs one. So I can understand

why The Hitman's Bodyguard got a sequel! Sure, I was kind of excited because I love Ryan Reynolds and Samuel L. Jackson, but truth be told after seeing the sequel, no, it didn't really need to be made. I'll get right to the point The Hitman's Wife's Bodyguard is not really that good of a movie and not even Salma Hayek being a badass with her gorgeous boobs can really save this movie. That might hey bet misogynistic to say, but when half your jokes about her character are about her boobs, I'm not the one to blame. And that should also should tell you something about the writing. Even though it's a bad movie, Ryan Reynolds, Salma, Hayek and Samuel L. Yes, it's a high octane action film and all of them are great and yes the one-liners are kind of funny, but also very predictable and we saw it all in the first film! The first film was fairly original... It's good and you'll watch it again and again, but the sequel is largely forgettable because it feels like all the good stuff happened in the first film. Same action, same jokes, same action movie tropes. It's almost as if they just

regurgitated the first film, changed a few things here while adding Morgan Freeman and Antonio Banderas and then called it a sequel! And who doesn't love a predictable action movie... Yes, I'm being sarcastic, but then again Michael Bay keeps making movies! There are a few things to like in this film. This movie was really made to show off how much of a badass Salma Hayek really is. She is still absolutely gorgeous in her 50s and doesn't look like she's aged at all from the movie Desperado. Ryan Reynolds is funny as usual, but this movie resembles more like any number of sequels to the The Fast and Furious where you have to somehow top yourself from the last film and the plot doesn't really matter. I guess it was nice to get a bit of a backstory of these characters that we grew to love in the first film. Origin stories can be nice, but it's not enough to save the film. I did laugh a few times, but I almost feel like at least for Ryan Reynolds all of his jokes are just warm up material before Deadpool 3, which is fine, but you shouldn't charge a full-price movie ticket for that sort of thing! I will say that it's a fun little action movie with a lot of great one-liners, that can be entertaining, but this is not a film that you should pay a full price movie ticket for and I definitely want my money back! Wait to rent it on Redbox or watch it free on cable. I wish the sequel could have been better, maybe it was a better film, but somehow the editor made it worse. Sometimes the editing is the true culprit of a bad film. If the first film is a good A -, the sequel is definitely a good D +. But at this point, I feel like they need to make a third and treat it like a Windows operating system where the new version is only fixing the old version. So why not round out these movies with a trilogy and the third one can fix the second one, but we all know it'll never be as good as the first one. If you go to the movie theater to see this film, make sure it's a matinee or at a dollar theater. It's not worth full price. A Quiet Place 2 by Julie Jones

A Quiet Place 2 is the first blockbuster movie being shown in theaters after the Pandemic and it was great to be back. John Krasinski and



Emily Blunt worked together on the first one and here we are for a sequel! So many people say that couples working together seems like a disaster, but they seem to make it work. Now, let's just see if lightning strikes twice! Quiet Place 2 is the sequel and picks up right where the first one left off. They even start the film with a little origin story scene, making sure that we all remember why we are here and what is happening. There are new challenges to face, but like the first, there are plenty of jump scares and heartfelt moments. While John Krasinksi didn't make it through the second one, Emily Blunt definitely revives the emotional struggle that comes with "momming" two kids in a tragic situation. The acting is nothing spectacular, but something has to be said for actors who can express characters in silence while retaining suspension of disbelief. I don't know that The Academy will be considering them, but the acting is definitely better than a lot of movies out there. Emily Blunt does a great job and with the addition of Cillian Murphy, you have two great character actors that bring a lot to the table and make the movie better than it is. If you think Cillian Murphey can't hold his own as an actor then you clearly need to check out Peaky Blinders on Netflix! The writing left a little bit to be desired, but not a lot. I thought that the dialogue was ok and the plot seemed viable. This film is a good continuation of the first and adding the origin story makes it better. But somehow the story fell just a little short for me. I didn't think it was unbearable, but I wasn't amazed. Maybe this movie is setting up a third film to round off the A Quiet Place trilogy. It

would be doable. Color and lighting isn't huge, as far as manipulation in this film. But, you will notice a few little tricks here and there, if you're paying attention. The beauty is that if you're not, it is seemless enough that it rolls through and adds to the intensity of this horror film. Cinematography and direction don't offer anything new, so there isn't a lot to talk about. But, it is easy to forget that the Quiet Place films are debuts for John Krasinski. While he hasn't established his style, yet, it isn't obvious that he's new to this. I'm not saying they're bad films, but Krasinski hasn't directed his Oscar worthy film yet. Overall, it was a good movie. It wasn't amazing or innovative, but if you enjoyed the first one you will enjoy the second. If you haven't seen either, they are worth watching on a binge. But, don't expect Citizen Kane. I give it an 8, because we don't do halves around here and it's not quite a nine. It isn't anything amazing, but it allows for the suspension of disbelief and is enough for you to invest in the story, though not without strings. Vera Farmiga and Patrick Wilson are good as usual. They tend to hold these movies together. The aesthetics and mood lend well to the film, giving you something great to work with if you live to settle into a horror movie. It definitely makes it feel a little eerie and dark. But, there is nothing new or innovative about it. And there doesn't need to be for this film to be good. The film direction and cinematography aren't much to comment on, either. Same song, different dance...nothing new. The story is a good one and based on a true story. 

Amazon Confirms It's Buying MGM For \$8.45 Billion

"James Bond Will Remain Theatrical Amid Amazon's Acquisition Of MGM, Eon Bosses Say!" MGM Will Plug Into Amazon Streaming Machine As It Hits Higher Gear



After months and weeks of

speculation, Amazon and MGM are merging in a deal that has the e-commerce giant acquiring the storied studio for \$8.45 billion. It's the first groundbreaking deal in a long anticipated marriage of the era's big tech players and Hollywood, sparked by a digital revolution in content and the explosion of streaming. The pact, which will recast Prime Video, is the second mega-merger in as many weeks following the planned combination of AT&T's WarnerMedia and Discovery. Amazon declined to comment beyond the release but a person close to the company said, as Deadline reported Friday, that it intends to continue MGM's theatrical releases and looks forward to MGM's fan-favorites hitting theaters. The announcement this morning is pretty bare bones and there's no press briefing planned. It's early days and the Seattle company didn't address some big issues including the structure of a merged leadership or the future of Epix. Amazon-MGM Deal: Deadline's Complete Coverage Amazon is holding its annual shareholder meeting today at noon and is bound to get some questions about the purchase. The pricetag, while no sweat for a company with a \$1.6 trillion market cap, is still a hefty for the studio and a triumph for MGM chairman Kevin Ulrich, whose Anchorage Capital has been a major investor for a decade. Bezos, at Amazon's last quarterly earnings in late April, gave Prime Video a shout out as it turned 10. He said over 175 million Prime members had streamed shows and movies over the past year and that streaming hours are up more than 70% yearon-year. Amazon Studios garnered 12 Academy Award nods and two wins, he noted, touting upcoming originals Tom Clancy's *Without Remorse, The Tomorrow War* and *The Underground Railroad*. (Bezos is stepping down as CEO of Amazon later this year for the new title of executive chairman, handing the reins to Andrew Jassy, who runs Amazon Web Services.)

Amazon did note MGM's nearly century-long history of filmmaking and said it complements the work of Amazon Studios, which has mostly focused on television production. "Amazon will help preserve MGM's heritage and catalog of films, and provide customers with greater access to these existing works. Through this acquisition, Amazon would empower MGM to continue to do what they do best: great storytelling," the Jeff Bezos-founded company said.

"MGM has a vast catalog with more than 4,000 films – 12 Angry Men, Basic Instinct, Creed, James Bond, Legally Blonde, Moonstruck, Poltergeist, Raging Bull, Robocop, Rocky, Silence of the Lambs, Stargate, Thelma & Louise, Tomb Raider, The Magnificent Seven, The Pink Panther, The Thomas Crown Affair, and many other icons - as well as 17,000 TV shows including Fargo, The Handmaid's Tale, and Vikings-that have collectively won more than 180 Academy Awards and 100 Emmys," said Mike Hopkins, senior VP of Prime Video and Amazon Studios. "The real financial value behind this deal is the treasure trove of IP in the deep catalog that we plan to reimagine and develop together with MGM's talented team." "It has been an honor to have been a part of the incredible transformation of Metro Goldwyn Mayer. To get here took immensely talented people with a true belief in one vision. On behalf of the Board, I would

like to thank the MGM team who have helped us arrive at this historic day," said Ulrich. "I am very proud that MGM's Lion, which has long evoked the Golden Age of Hollywood, will continue its storied history, and the idea born from the creation of United Artists lives on in a way the founders originally intended, driven by the talent and their vision. The opportunity to align MGM's storied history with Amazon is an inspiring combination," he added. The companies didn't anticipate when they expect the deal to close but noted that it's subject to regulatory approval.

Steven Spielberg's Amblin Partners. In Deal To Make Movies For Netflix



What a difference two years and a global pandemic make. Steven Spielberg, who a couple of years ago was quoted - his camp maintains he never said it or anything he might have said was severely taken out of context - drawing a clear line between theatrically released films and streamer films, has berthed his Amblin Partners into a partnership with Netflix that will cover multiple new feature films per year. It shows once again the Netflix-led progress toward dissolving the lines between streamed and theatrical films and symbolically it is a big deal for Netflix's Ted Sarandos and Scott Stuber. The Netflix deal will co-exist side by side with the one Spielberg and Amblin have at Universal Pictures. Neither will have first shot at Amblin properties; Spielberg will make some films for Universal, and others to be made for Netflix. The expectation is that Amblin will generate multiple films per year for Netflix, which has a voracious appetite for content and releases a new film per week. Amblin's Universal deal was extended last December, at which time comments reflected the possibility that a streaming deal might be in the offing. The two companies have been collaborating for some time in an informal capacity. Netflix released the Amblinproduced, Aaron Sorkin-directed The Trial of the Chicago 7, a film that garnered six Oscar nominations. Netflix stepped up to acquire to finance and distribute Maestro, the film that Bradley Cooper is directing and starring

in on the iconic composer Leonard Bernstein. That film is in pre-production.Said Amblin Partners chairman Spielberg on Monday in a statement: "At Amblin, storytelling will forever be at the center of everything we do, and from the minute Ted and I started discussing a partnership, it was abundantly clear that we had an amazing opportunity to tell new stories together and reach audiences in new ways. This new avenue for our films, alongside the stories we continue to tell with our longtime family at Universal and our other partners, will be incredibly fulfilling for me personally since we get to embark on it together with Ted, and I can't wait to get started with him, Scott, and the entire Netflix team." Netflix Co-CEO and chief content officer Sarandos called Spielberg "a creative visionary and leader and, like so many others around the world, my growing up was shaped by his memorable characters and stories that have been enduring, inspiring and awakening. We cannot wait to get to work with the Amblin team and we are honored and thrilled to be part of this chapter of Steven's cinematic history." Said Jeff Small, Amblin Partners CEO: "By deepening our ties with Netflix via this new film partnership, we are building on what has for many years been an incredibly successful working relationship in both television and film. The global platform they've built - with more than 200 million members - speaks for itself, and we're extremely grateful to have the opportunity to work closely with Scott and his amazing team to deliver Amblin's iconic brand of storytelling to the Netflix audience." Stuber, Netflix's Head of Global Film, said that "Amblin and Steven Spielberg are synonymous with incredible entertainment. Their passion and artistry combine to make films that both captivate and challenge audiences. We look forward to working with

Steven, Jeff and the entire Amblin family on a new slate of films that will delight generations for years to come. "CAA advised Amblin Partners on the deal. Amblin's Universal output includes the Best Picture Oscar winner Green Book and the Sam Mendes-directed 1917 which won three Oscars. Upcoming is the Colin Trevorrowdirected Jurassic World: Dominion, which shot during the pandemic and will bow on June 10, 2022. Amblin is also producer on Stillwater, the Focus Features film that Tom McCarthy directed and Matt Damon stars in. That film premieres at Cannes next month. Spielberg will direct and has also written with oft-collaborator Tony Kushner an Amblin-produced film based loosely on the master filmmaker's childhood growing up in Arizona, with Michelle Williams, Paul Dano, Gabriel LaBelle, Seth Rogen and Julia Butters. One would assume there might be some jockeying between Universal and Netflix over a film like that, but that one will go through a theatrical release at Universal. One area the director will not revisit is *laws*. Deadline heard recently that Universal broached the subject to reboot Spielberg's breakout classic, with Spielberg producing, and the answer was a firm no. Some at Universal and Amblin said this was already known and not a recent conversation. Whatever, while Jaws sequels fell far short of Spielberg's original, some films should just be left alone and appreciated in their original form. Spielberg directed a number of them, including E.T. and Schindler's List.

The Mitchells vs. The Machines is a movie that is simple in concept and flawless in execution. It was released on Netflix not too long ago by Sony, and it's a joy to watch. The idea isn't anything special; it's just a family road trip conflict focusing on the miscommunication issues between a father and his daughter (and a robot apocalypse, I guess). So why is it so great? Well, there are three things in this movie that really make it shine--comedy, animation, and characters.

The colors in this film pop, but not to the point of being an eyesore. Every character has a good design that perfectly fits them and gets their point across. Speaking of which, it's finally time to talk about the characters.

As I said earlier, this movie focuses on a dysfunctional family of four, each member with their own diverse and realistic personality. However, rather than being a family that hates each other and is trying to stop fighting, they're a loving family that just has trouble getting along sometimes. The conflict is focused on the wilderness-loving father and his daughter, an amateur film maker who is planning on going to school for it. There is also the mother, who is just trying to hold everyone together, and the younger brother, a dinosaur-lover that, as the movie puts it, "gets" the sister. As the story goes along, there are never any forced fights or ridiculous and unnecessary emotional cliches. Everything is realistic, and they truly feel like a real, genuine family just struggling through each of their own trials.

All in all, this movie is a wild ride packed to the brim with its unique, ridiculous charm. It really feels like everyone who worked on this film just had a really fun time working on it, and I'm glad they did. If that weren't true, we'd never have them to thank for this colorful explosion of a film. From its hysterical comedy to its stunning animation to its wonderfully well-done characters, this movie flabbergasted me with how good it was, and it was a treat to experience. *The Mitchells vs. The Machines* is truly a gem, and I'd happily watch it again. Jupiter's Legacy: What we Really Thought of it!

Countless Marvel, DC, and other superhero movies and comics have taught us that superheroes are more than just *super*; they're real people (or sometimes technically aliens) with their own unique backstories, family dynamics, and complicated lives. Netflix's new original show *Jupiter's Legacy* takes the complex lives of superheroes to an entirely new level, as we follow the adventures of an aging superhero team and the next generation struggling to fill their shoes. The original members of the Union of Justice have been doing their best to keep their world free of crime for nearly a century, but there's no getting around the fact that they won't be around forever. Each episode of Jupiter's Legacy alternates back and



forth between the present day, when these aging heroes are struggling with the future of their own children as the next generation of the Union, and the past, when the Utopian/Sheldon (Josh Duhamel), Lady Liberty/Grace (Leslie Bibb), and their friends received their own powers.

Along the way, we are introduced to the Utopian's moral creed of never killing, no matter the situation--a concept that society in general and his own children in particular feel can't stand up to modern supervillains. Viewers also get a sense of just how much pressure is put on these younger superheroes. The Paragon/Brandon (Andrew Horton) feels he can never live up to his dad's expectations, who makes him feel like he did the wrong thing even when he saves lives. Meanwhile, his sister Chloe (Elena Kampouris) has fully rejected being a hero, choosing instead to use her celebrity status to do photoshoots and gain sponsorship deals... and live wildly in the local party scene.

It really all makes for a fascinating, strongly character-driven show, when all is said and done, even if it takes time for some of the characters to develop truly threedimensional personalities. Viewers may well spend the first half of the first season developing a strong dislike to Sheldon, whose determination to do the right thing--and never kill anybody, ever--comes across as outdated and even dangerous in some situations. And the way he treats his own children--the high expectations, the lectures--doesn't make him any more likeable. Meanwhile, Brandon, who could easily be the star of the show, feels a little... flat... for much of the early episodes. It's not until his drive and passion really start to shine through later on in the show that viewers will really start to love him and the future he stands for. Overall, though, the actors do a good job with their roles despite the potential awkwardness of playing the same characters, decades apart. This aids in our ability to really see how the characters' experiences in their youth shaped who they became as adults, and the sense of rightness and

responsibility they strove to champion as heroes. The only really awkward thing about it is that the makeup jobs aren't always entirely convincing, even taking into account the idea that heroes age differently. Lady Liberty's smooth skin is at odds with her silver hair; it's hard for us to believe that she's really so old when she looks like her younger self simply put on a wig. *Jupiter's Legacy* is a fascinating show and does justice to its original source material. It's binge-able and has characters that will stick with you. Maybe, we'll actually get a season 2!

When you have something like that, then really all you're getting is an action movie where the plot doesn't matter. But great Sci-Fi movies especially alien invasion movies shouldn't just be an action movie. There's always a better story to tell. Like a good oldfashioned be Sci-Fi movie, maybe you don't really need a huge plot to tell an entertaining story and that's where I think the film The Tomorrow War blurs that line between great Sci-Fi and B-Sci-Fi films. Modern Expectations for "The Mighty Ducks: Game Changers"

Season 1 Review

As someone who grew up in the '80s, but more memorably into the '90s, I can look back on a number of moments connected to entertainment during that era. In 1992, specifically, a handful of famed Disney productions were released and I could seemingly not get enough of any of it. While "Aladdin" was probably the biggest film that they put out that year, there was another, which became a big success in its own right. It was called "The Mighty Ducks." Though it did not make nearly as much money at box office as the aforementioned title did and it was not nearly as well-received by critics at the time, its moderate level of success led to two, additional sequels: "D2: The Mighty Ducks are Back!" and "The Mighty Ducks 3."

I can vaguely recall my experience during the first two movies, but by the time the third film was released, I had all but lost any interest in the franchise. I guess you could say that the teen version of me had outgrown it, somehow. Over the years, I never really returned to any of it, but like most people who had reached the age of nostalgia, I eventually became curious to re-experience it all, again, but this time, through the eyes of an adult. Do you remember someone ever telling you to, "Never meet your heroes" and wondered what it meant? Well, I would add that, sometimes, you should never try to relive your childhood memories, for possibly the same or similar reasons... What I was trying to say, in so many words, is that the original "Mighty Ducks" films are only as good as nostalgia will carry you and that beyond any of this, the movies are objectively bad, on numerous levels. I found myself feeling pretty frustrated by what the filmmakers had tried to push out. As someone who has grown to understand the game of hockey as a sports commentator, the gameplay does not hold up well and as someone who now watches movies from a much more analytical perspective, the stories are largely flimsy and shallow. Oh, and forget about continuity between the three movies; they were all directed by someone differently from the one prior. Some characters were even written out without any real explanation in the story, itself, but I digress. When word got to me that Disney was bringing back the franchise with an all-new streaming series, "The Mighty Ducks: Game Changers," I hoped for the best, but feared for the worst. Of course, I had probably already seen the worst and standards have certainly changed since the 1990s. So, what could possibly go wrong?...

It begins with 'Episode 1: Game On!' Lauren Graham ("Middle School: The Worst Years of My Life) is Alex Morrow, a single, hardworking and under-appreciated mother of a child, Evan, played by Brady Noon. He is trying out for the Mighty Ducks, who are now a powerhouse hockey team in the Minneapolis, Minnesota area, but in order to keep things that way, they must recruit only the best and Evan is not among them. At least not now. For anyone familiar with the franchise, this team is now very reminiscent of the Hawks from the very first film, back in 1992, although the colors are different. Alex does not seem to understand the concept of "dedication at any level" and the present coach of the Ducks, Coach T, played by Dylan Playfair, seems to lack the requisite sympathy to truly care for any of the kids participating. Shortly after things unfold, Evan and his mother plan to start up a brand new team, very much like the plot in 1994's "The Little Giants." Nick Ganz, played by Maxwell Simkins, and Koob, played by Luke Islam, are recruited early, along with Lauren, played by Bella Higginbotham, and Maya, played by Taegan Burns. Logan, played by Kiefer O'Reilly, and Sam, played by De'Jon Watts, round out the rest of the primary players on the team that soon becomes known as the "Don't Bothers," who dress up like the Wyoming Cowboys of the NCAA, in a hideous arrangement of brown and yellow, which actually fits the team nicely, in my view. Oh, and of course, the immortal Emilio Estevez ("The Public") reprises his role of Gordon Bombay, but is now down-and-out and "hates hockey." I can only imagine where this is going to go from here. The next two episodes, 'Dusters' and 'Breakaway,' are about the early growing stages of a new team that seemingly cannot compete with anyone in the league that they have just joined. They lose their first couple of games by a combined score of 29-1, including a 17-1 defeat at the hands of the Mighty Ducks. What everyone on the Don't Bothers realizes quickly is that losing and losing big are not fun; competing is too important to "not bother with." However, with their last-second goal versus the Ducks, the Don't Bothers have scored for the first time in the season and there seems to be some hope for the future, as a result, but it comes with some assistance from an outside source and the new coach, Alex, is really struggling, though it is understandable as to why. Meanwhile, Nick has developed a crush on the snack stand waitress, Winnie Berigan, played by Em Haine, who seems to shuffle through young men associated with the various snack ingredients, such as cocoa and mustard. As Nick joins the new hockey team, he is also replaced by the father of the girl whom he once broadcasted games with: Mary Jo (aka "MJ"), played by Lia Franklin. Her dad, Terry, is quite humorous filling in for Nick, bringing back memories of the second man in the booth for the "Major League" movies of the late '80s and early '90s. Episode 4: 'Hockey Moms' pits Alex with her boss from work, Stephanie, played by Julee Cerda ("Madeline's Madeline"), who has has a child playing with the Ducks, Trevor Reddick, played by Kasra Wong. An awkward dinner involving Bombay as Alex's date with Stephanie and her husband leads to a competitive showcase on the ice, where one mom edges out the other, but only due to a strange technicality. The cute side stories seem to continue mostly with Nick, who invites Evan over for a sleepover, but Koob winds up being included and shines as a singer who can manipulate parents when he so chooses. At some point, the duo of mom and son, Alex and Evan, meets with Bombay, to form a triangle. Does that seem familiar?

Episode 5: 'Cherry Picker' might be the strongest episode in the series. Here, we see the development of bonding between two of the girls on the team, Lauren and Maya; one is part of the "in" crowd at school, while the other likes to wear capes and cosplay with her circle of friends. Wha you come to see is that either one of them is capable of being judgmental of the other. In other words, it is a two-way street. Elsewhere, Evan reunites with his wayward dad, who bonds with Bombay during a wing-eating contest, involving Cholula hot sauce. The bonds are strong enough to translate to the Don't Bothers' first win of the season, 5-4, over the Hawks, and Evan scored every meaningful goal in the game, resulting in a 1-5 record on the season.

The following two episodes, 'Spirit of the Ducks' and 'Pond Hockey,' represent the next stage of the team's development. Sofi Hanson-Bhatt, played by Swayam Bhatia, has become good friends with Evan and switched over to the Don't Bothers from the Mighty Ducks, strengthening the roster in the process, but now Evan has earned the right to rejoin the Ducks and must make a decision on what to do next. Bombay sees an old group of Ducks and the real story about his past and why he left the club comes to the surface. Alex is now beginning to look and sound like a real coach and the Don't Bothers continue to string together more victories, albeit, their methods are still quite silly. For the final three episodes, we have: 'Change on the Fly,' 'Head Games' and 'State of Play.' Success is breeding confidence for Coach Alex and the Don't Bothers, but at least one player is still struggling, though he has a lot going for himself, elsewhere. Bombay finds a way to teach him how to be effective on the ice and now he appears to have the total package, at least according to one teammate. As the hockey season draws to a close, some major shifts occur at the coaching position, back and forth, between Alex and Bombay, but not for the reasons you might presume. At times, the story begins to feel like something from "Cobra Kai," which I do not mean as a bad thing. It comes down to how the players behave around each other, especially when players from the other teams are in the mix. As you know, young people are quite fickle. When the final tournament ensues, the team that should win does, but the team you want to win finds victory in another variation and as a result, there is a major turn of events to close out the series. It is a meaningful and satisfying finish, in my opinion.

The way "Game Changers" wraps up makes me wonder if Disney was feeling very confident about how the reaction might turn out for this show. There was such a significant ending that the story seemed mostly unbelievable, at that stage. If it had occurred over the span of two or three years, it would have made a lot more sense, but how much reality do we really want or need, under the circumstances?

I think those who were involved found a nice balance between nostalgia and originality for this series, overall, but the writing was still weak at times, too. I certainly enjoyed myself and found more that I liked about this show than I did not like. I would even say that the quality of this series was better than the previous movies. So, modern times have affected this franchise in a largely-positive way. That is what I think about it, anyway.



D&D Dark Alliance sucked so hard an F-5 tornado from Oklahoma is suing for copy right infringement, so I have taken to renaming the game Dung heaps & Dumb-asses: Detritus Amassed. "But Scott this article is about Warhammer: Vermintide 2!" yep you are absolutely correct and sometimes it takes a steaming pile of shit generated by outdated neck beards to make you notice all the good things in your life you already have. So in true southern fashion I'm going to talk about the game I like and how well its doing, as a way of shaming the lesser game for being a massive disappointment while it sits in the corner and cries. What happens when you get the Legend of Zelda: Breath of the Wild and the movie Kung Fu Panda... No, this is not the answer to some inane trivia question. Well, the answer would be the video game Bio Mutant! Honestly that's what I thought I was playing, some weird version of the movie Kung Fu Panda that was meant to look like breath of the wild! This game has been on our radar for the last couple of years and it's another one of those games that should have come out last year, but got delayed during the pandemic. And to say the least, this game is not at all what I expected. Now I'm not going to say that it's an absolutely horrible game, it's not, but that doesn't mean it's necessarily great and you should run out and buy it especially a full price. I honestly feel that this is a game that would be perfect for PlayStation Now or the Xbox Game Pass, Something that you can download on a subscription service for free on day one. Sometimes you get really great games

that you can do that with but most of them are just okay or average at best. Biomutant is something perfect for that.

I really hate when the expectations for a video game is a lot better than the game itself and unfortunately Biomutant. as fun as it is, just feels very underwhelming. It's a fun open world game with genetically engineered animals set in a feudal Japan type of setting where you have mythic creatures and Samurai. It's a cool idea, but I can't say the game really delivers on the concept. The more that I played, the more that I felt like it'd be a lot better of a game if there was a multiplayer aspect to it and you could "squad up" with three to four players. The gaming mechanics are fairly simple. It's basically a hack and slash game where you have to complete little missions to open up the rest of the world. You can say it's a lot like Immortals: Fenyx Rising, the open world animated game that came out last winter. But I would say that's a much better game. Biomutant almost feels like a B version of Immortals. There are a lot of things to like about this game, it will definitely keep you playing for hours so when a lot of ways you do get your money's worth. As we always place value on a game, it seems these days that only true open world games can really be worth the full retail price. And they're definitely is an escapism in this game. If you're just looking for a fun little adventure where you can hack and slash your way through a vibrant world, then this might be okay. But there isn't anything really special about Biomutant... bothing that we haven't really seen before. The story is not even that interesting.


But I don't want to rag on this game too much... we've played worst games that never should have been put out. This isn't one of them, but it's a good example of having too many expectations for a fun open world game and being let down. Those kinds of games aren't the ones you buy at full price. These are the kind of games that should be on a Game Pass. With so many games becoming available on day one with the Xbox Game Pass, some I would have gladly paid full price for like The Outer Worlds... Biomutant is one that I feel like I wasted my money on because it didn't give me anything more than some of the other games that I've played over the last few years that were great discoveries on a Game Pass service. And while I do make the comparison to Legend of Zelda: Breath of the Wild and I certainly have my problems with that game being more about nostalgia than anything else, at least that one is worth getting a whole new gaming system like the Nintendo Switch just to play it. But maybe with Biomutant, it's really about finding the perfect audience... kid gamers who aren't ready for huge violent open worlds like it in Assassin's Creed game or a Far Cry game. The mechanics aren't hard to pick up in Biomutant and the puzzles that you kind of have to solve along the way or fun. However, if you are going to buy this game get it at a discount because you really shouldn't spend any more than \$20 for it. I may go back and play this game, but I'll do it when it's available on Game Pass or PlayStation now. And as I said before, the developers missed a golden opportunity to take what seems like a great concept and make a fantastic multiplayer squad game because I would totally play this game with my gaming squad. It's a little too boring to play alone!

Mass Effect Legendary Edition

Why it's worth it!

If you're trying to decide whether the legendary edition is worth it, (whether you're familiar with or brand new to the Mass Effect universe) here are some of the reasons that it is. For brand new players, this is an absolute steal! Mass Effect: Legendary Edition contains the entire Mass Effect trilogy and all of the single player DLC for less than the price of a single full price game. For players like me who have played all the games before, it is full of nostalgia with better quality.

Right off the bat, the actual mechanics of the game are much improved from its original counterpart. The aiming and stability of the weapons is miles better. The textures and colors are greatly improved. The cut scene visuals have been enhanced to look great on 4K televisions. The character visual (mostly seen in conversations) is upgraded but it is also the place where you notice the age of the game animation. The attention to detail in the environment adds so much to the beauty of the game. This is from playing on an Xbox One, so the visuals may be even more enhanced and refined on the latest console.

The M35 Mako (the vehicle Shepard takes to land on worlds) got a full mechanics makeover. The missile and the turret firing systems are exponentially more accurate to where the player is actually aiming. The zoom on the weapons system can see farther and it so much clearer than the original Mako. The boost now gives the vehicle a boost that is useful and is capable of getting the vehicle out of a position if it gets stuck. The jump boost has been slightly altered so that it may be used more often and the Mako can jump higher. The overall control of the driving is smoother and more accurate. The Mako got a full makeover and all for the better.

Veteran Mass Effect players will appreciate some of the seemingly smaller changes that were always a sore spot. For starters, anyone who has played Mass Effect knows the endless elevator rides that are more or less glorified load screens. In the Legendary Edition, those elevators rides have been made skippable because sometimes you just want to get where you're going and the squad banter is not nearly entertaining enough for how long those elevators take. The HUD has gotten a total overhaul. It is now in the bottom center of the screen with clear bars for the shield and health of both you and your squad mates. In the bottom left corner where the health used to be now shows Shepard's gun and how close it is to overheating. There is also a different system for leveling up. A player can still choose classic mode which gives you a couple technique points over the course of 60 levels. However, there is now a legendary mode option which makes 30 the max level that can be reached. The same number of points are still distributed but with legendary mode the player gets twice as many points per level increase which is ultimately more useful when trying to achieve milestones.

While there are many more improvements that have been made, the best way to truly experience them all is to purchase Mass Effect: Legendary Edition and play them for yourself. Whether you've been with Mass Effect since the beginning, you've never played the games, or anything in between this edition is worth every single penny.

The 90's Martial Arts Movie You Should Watch If You Like Cobra Kai

The ***Paper Tigers** Film Review By Alex Moore



In some form or fashion, without even realizing it, I have been a fan of martial arts films for most of my life. Yes, we all loved "The Karate Kid," but the franchise was such an instant success and has remained relevant even to this day with "Cobra Kai." The purists tend to be offended when others try to step inside of their inner circle, so to speak. If I may digress, it was not just "The Karate Kid" movies that swept America by storm in its day. A few short years after the original film, there was the first "Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles" movie, as well, and although it was not as universally (and positively) accepted by the critics, it was applauded by most fans of the animated series it was based on. Let me see. What else?...

Well, I remember a more serious and dramatic martial arts film, which I believe was trying to cash in on the crest of popularity in the sport at the time. It was called "Best of the Best." I watched it many times over and still go back to it every so often, in spite of its mixed reception. Does anyone else remember "Sidekicks" or "3 Ninjas?" How about some more obscure examples, such as "The Magic Kid" and "Showdown?" Yes, most of these were poorly received by most viewers, but the point is that the competitive sport of martial arts has never really lost its shine since the onset of its popularity, way back in the early 1970s (in the United States). It was no less than a month ago that I happily watched the reboot of "Mortal Kombat." Now, I find myself digging in to a much more light-hearted experience in "The Paper Tigers," which was largely filmed in the region of Seattle, Washington, an apparent tribute to the legendary

status of Bruce Lee, himself. Before I proceed any further, I would like to point out that if anyone who views this movie is not personally committed to the sport, itself, it is more-than-likely that you will not fully appreciate the craft of this particular film. I was once trained in the sport, myself, but I have been out of the game for quite some time now and I would be lying if I said that I were still as invested as I used to be...

"The Paper Tigers" consist of three men: Alain Uy as Danny, Ron Yuan ("Mulan") as Hing and Mykel Shannon Jenkins ("Teleios") as Jim. Much in the vein of 2004's "Four Brothers," they are reunited, after some time apart, by a tragedy that deeply impacts all of them in a very

similar kind of way. The key difference is that these men have all led pretty harmless lives, which is not a bad thing, by the way. The story felt a little bit disjointed during that first segment, but begins to gain its focus once the real action begins. In order to gather information connected to their unified loss, they must succeed in a series of one-on-one, hand-to-hand sparring sessions, but without the benefit of pads and headgear. As expected, they come through when it matters the most, but come up short early. In other words, there is nothing surprising about the patters of the story, itself. However, the interaction and progress of the characters, themselves, are what really count. This means that even though this is an action movie, of sorts, it is more character-driven than it is plot-driven.

I would say that "The Paper Tigers" is more comedic than your basic

martial arts title, too. I do not mean to draw any comparisons to "Kung Pow! Enter the Fist," as that was a lot more zany and over-the-top (and not nearly as effective, either). This entry was more charming and less goofy and I am pleased by that. The fight scenes may seem repetitive, in terms of how they are used in the story, but each match brings something new to the table when you focus on how they are executed from a presentation aspect. There was no major effort to look stylish or fancy, but the choreography is strong enough on its own that it did not need anything very fancy. True practitioners of the sport ought to enjoy that, in all honesty. Is there anything about this film that really stands out? In my view, no, but there was almost nothing that bothered or annoyed me, either. Do I think that the editing and overall execution of the story could have been better? I would say, "yes," but how far should any of us set our expectations in the first place? After all, this is Tran Quoc Bao's feature movie, directorial debut. For that, it is a fairly impressive project.

If I can be frank, I did not think that this was as strong as the previous martial arts film that I saw, though I have to concede that these are two, very different kinds of martial arts movies. In fact, I would put them just about as far apart on the sub-genre spectrum as possible. Objectively-speaking, I enjoyed "The Paper Tigers," but not as much as I enjoyed the new "Mortal Kombat," but the critic scoring, up to this point, tells a pretty different opinion. Oh well! Watch them both and you will probably like them both enough to consider watching them again one day. I cannot complain about that, in any year.





PRINCE WROTE THIS SONG?

"Six o'clock already...l was just in the middle of a dream..." By Chad Womack



You ever hear a song 4 the very 1st time and u feel intimately familiar with it somehow? Something about the melody or a particular lyric just sticks with u and u just cannot shake the feeling that "DANG...somehow I KNOW I've BEEN here before." When most of us heard The Bangles singing "Manic Monday" on the radio 4 the 1st time in early 1986...it sparked a not-so-subtle feeling of instant familiarity...and if u ever heard it played back to back with Prince's classic "1999", u immediately realize y it does. A few years before when Prince was assembling tracks for his "girl's group" Apollonia 6 as a companion piece to the "Purple Rain" album, a song came to him "in the middle of a dream" that lifted the melody from the opening lines of his hit from a few years before. The next day he laid down the track with his own vocals and had the ladies lay down their vocal tracks the day after, with every on their self-titled debut, but, as things usually happened with Prince, nothing was ever etched in stone

intention of including it on their self-titled debut, but, as things usually happened with Prince, nothing was ever etched in stone.

After assembling the configuration of the album and recording a handful of other tracks, the song was shelved in favor of "Happy Birthday, Mr. Christian." We all remember that tune, right? No??? Yeah, I did not think so. Though it might have made a much better choice song wise, it just did not fit the aesthetic that Prince was going for with the group overall. Sadly for Apollonia 6, the song was shelved and the album it was originally intended for peaked at #62 on the Billboard 200. After guesting onstage with Prince and the Revolution several times on the mammoth tour in support of "Purple Rain" the girls disbanded, thus making their debut album their ONLY album. Apollonia 6 was no more…but what of "Manic Monday?"

In early 1985, a few weeks after Prince had released his follow up album to "Purple Rain", "Around the World in a Day" he and Apollonia caught the video for "Hero Takes A Fall" by The Bangles and he immediately became fascinated by up and coming all girls group from L.A. with the very Beatlesque vibe. After



receiving a cassette copy of the song originally intended for the Apollonia 6 project, the ladies dove in to the track with unbridled delight, recording it from scratch and crafting a truly memorable pop classic out of it, hitting #2 on the U.S. charts bested only by Prince's own chart topping "Kiss" but the story of "Manic Monday" does not end there.

On Prince's birthday June 7, 2019, the Prince Estate and NPG/WB Records released "Originals" on the streaming platform Tidal followed by a wider release of various physical configurations a few weeks later. "Originals" is a collection of tracks that Prince had offered to various musicians over the course of his historic career but focused primarily on songs from the 80s and 90s that were basically not much more than glorified demos. Among these tracks r such classics as Prince's original versions of "The Glamorous Life" and "Nothing Compares to You" and of course, the original guide vocal for "Manic Monday" thus bringing the song full circle, winding up on a posthumous release under the name of the man that started it all. What a long, strange trip it's been, but, like the song says, "Time it goes so fast…when you're having fun!"

Some of it is so massive in the recording I can hardly believe we pulled it off - it's very epic, some of it. And I like that. "And at the same time, there's little corners of it which are very simple, very understated, very emotionally naked. I discovered so much of what I'm saying in the album I still feel. I still feel those dangers, those fears, those hopes, those dreams." The album will be released as part of a Collector's Edition box set - which will include an exclusive white-vinyl LP, two

CDs, a 32-page book, a 12" art print, a download card and an enamel badge all presented in a lift-lid box- as well as 1LP black vinyl, 1CD, deluxe 2CD, cassette and digital formats. A limited-edition box-set is available exclusively on Queen Online Store with a signed 12" art print, as is a limitededition 1LP picture disc. And Brian has revealed the record is the first in a series he's got planned. He said: "This is part of a series. The Brian May Gold Series. Each of them will have a little gold stamp on. "Bob Rice is caring for the pianos and other keyboards. Paul Davies is handling of Ralph's drums. "It has been a long time since we have been together and more than a few tears have been shed." Neil also opened up on the location for the sessions, and described the environment as "magic". He added: "We are so happy to be back in the barn, a barn built to replicate the 1850s barn that had collapse


What advice do you have for fans getting into cosplay?

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'Dragon man' fossil may replace Neanderthals as our closest relative!



A near-perfectly preserved ancient human fossil known as the Harbin cranium sits in the Geoscience Museum in Hebei GEO University. The largest of known *Homo* skulls, scientists now say this skull represents a newly discovered human species named *Homo longi* or "Dragon Man." Their findings, appearing in three papers publishing June 25 in the journal *The Innovation*, suggest that the *Homo longi* lineage may be our closest relatives -- and has the potential to reshape our understanding of human evolution.

"The Harbin fossil is one of the most complete human cranial fossils in the world," says author Qiang Ji, a professor of paleontology of Hebei GEO University. "This fossil preserved many morphological details that are critical for understanding the evolution of the *Homo* genus and the origin of *Homo sapiens*." The cranium was reportedly discovered in the 1930s in Harbin City of the Heilongjiang province of China. The massive skull could hold a brain comparable in size to modern humans' but had larger, almost square eye sockets, thick brow ridges, a wide mouth, and oversized teeth. "While it shows typical

archaic human features, the Harbin cranium presents a mosaic combination of primitive and derived characters setting itself apart from all the other previously-named Homo species," says Ji, leading to its new species designation of Homo longi. Scientists believe the cranium came from a male individual, approximately 50 years old, living in a forested, floodplain environment as part of a small community. "Like Homo sapiens, they hunted mammals and birds, and gathered fruits and vegetables, and perhaps even caught fish," remarks author Xijun Ni, a professor of primatology and paleoanthropology at the Chinese Academy of Sciences and Hebei GEO University. Given that the Harbin individual was likely very large in size as well as the location where the skull was found, researchers suggest *H*. *longi* may have been adapted for harsh environments, allowing them to disperse throughout Asia. Using a series of geochemical analyses, Ji, Ni, and their team dated the Harbin fossil to at least 146,000 years, placing it in the Middle Pleistocene, a dynamic era of human species migration. They hypothesize that *H. longi* and *H. sapiens* could have encountered each other during this era. "We see multiple evolutionary lineages of Homo species and populations coexisting in Asia, Africa, and Europe during that time. So, if Homo sapiens indeed got to East Asia that early, they could have a chance to interact with *H. longi*, and since we don't know when the Harbin group disappeared, there could have been later encounters as well," says author Chris Stringer, a

paleoanthropologist at the Nature History Museum in London. Looking farther back in time, the researchers also find that *Homo longi* is one of our closest hominin relatives, even more closely related to us than Neanderthals. "It is widely believed that the Neanderthal belongs to an extinct lineage that is the closest relative of our own species. However, our discovery suggests that the new lineage we identified that includes *Homo longi* is the actual sister group of *H. sapiens*," says Ni. Their reconstruction of the human tree of life also suggests that the common ancestor we share with Neanderthals existed even further back in time. "The divergence time between *H. sapiens* and the Neanderthals may be even deeper in evolutionary history than generally believed, over one million years," says Ni. If true, we likely diverged from Neanderthals roughly 400,000 years earlier than scientists had thought. The researchers say that findings gathered from the Harbin cranium have the potential to rewrite major elements of human evolution. Their analysis into the life history of *Homo longi* suggest they were strong, robust humans whose potential interactions with Homo sapiens may have shaped our history in turn. "Altogether, the Harbin cranium provides more evidence for us to understand Homo diversity and evolutionary relationships among these diverse Homo species and populations," says Ni. "We found our long-lost sister lineage."

THE GOLDILOCKS SUPERNOVA

The discovery of a new type of supernova illuminates a medieval mystery!



A worldwide team led by UC Santa Barbara scientists at Las Cumbres Observatory has discovered the first convincing evidence for a new type of stellar explosion -- an electron-capture supernova. While they have been theorized for 40 years, real-world examples have been elusive. They are thought to arise from the explosions of massive super-asymptotic giant branch (SAGB) stars, for which there has also been scant evidence. The discovery, published in *Nature Astronomy*, also sheds new light on the thousand-year mystery of the supernova from A.D. 1054 that was visible all over the world in the daytime, before eventually becoming the Crab Nebula. Historically, supernovae have fallen into two main types: thermonuclear and iron-core collapse. A thermonuclear supernova is the explosion of a white dwarf star after it gains matter in a binary star system. These white dwarfs are the dense cores of ash that remain after a low-mass star (one up to about 8 times the mass of the sun) reaches the end of its life. An iron core-collapse supernova occurs when a massive star -- one more than about 10 times the mass of the sun -- runs out of nuclear fuel and its iron core collapses, creating a black hole or neutron star. Between these two main types of supernovae are electron-capture supernovae. These stars stop fusion when their cores are made of oxygen, neon and magnesium; they aren't massive enough to create iron. While gravity is always trying to crush a star, what keeps most stars from collapsing is either ongoing fusion or, in cores where fusion has stopped, the fact that you can't pack the atoms any tighter. In an electron capture supernova, some of the electrons in the oxygen-neon-magnesium core get smashed into their atomic nuclei in a process called electron capture. This removal of electrons causes the core of the star to buckle under its own weight and collapse, resulting in an electroncapture supernova. If the star had been slightly heavier, the core elements could have fused to create heavier elements, prolonging its life. So it is a kind of reverse Goldilocks situation: The star isn't light enough to escape its core collapsing, nor is it heavy enough to prolong its life and die later via different means. That's the theory that was formulated beginning in 1980 by Ken'ichi Nomoto of the University of Tokyo and others. Over the decades, theorists have formulated predictions of what to look for in an electron-capture supernova and their SAGB star progenitors. The stars should have a lot of mass, lose much of it before exploding, and this mass near the dying star should be of an unusual chemical composition. Then the electroncapture supernova should be weak, have little radioactive fallout, and have neutron-rich elements in the core. The new study is led by Daichi Hiramatsu, a graduate student at UC Santa Barbara and Las Cumbres Observatory (LCO). Hiramatsu is a core member of the Global Supernova Project, a worldwide team of scientists using dozens of telescopes around and above the globe. The team found that the supernova SN 2018zd had many unusual characteristics, some of which were seen for the first time in a supernova. It helped that the supernova was relatively nearby -- only 31 million light-years away -- in the galaxy NGC 2146. This allowed the team to examine archival images taken by the Hubble Space Telescope prior to the explosion and to detect the likely progenitor star before it exploded. The observations were consistent with another recently identified SAGB star in the Milky Way, but inconsistent with models of red supergiants, the progenitors of normal iron core-collapse supernovae. The authors looked through all published data on supernovae, and found that while some had a few of the indicators predicted for electron-capture supernovae, only SN 2018zd had all six: an apparent SAGB progenitor, strong pre-supernova mass loss, an unusual stellar chemical composition, a weak explosion, little radioactivity and a neutron-rich core. "We started by asking 'what's this weirdo?" Hiramatsu said. "Then we examined every aspect of SN 2018zd and realized that all of them can be explained in the electron-capture scenario." The new discoveries also illuminate some mysteries of the most famous supernova of the past. In A.D. 1054 a supernova happened in the Milky Way Galaxy that, according to Chinese and Japanese records, was so bright that it could be seen in the daytime for 23 days, and at night for nearly two years. The resulting remnant, the Crab Nebula, has been studied in great detail. The Crab Nebula was previously the best candidate for an electron-capture supernova, but its status was uncertain

partly because the explosion happened nearly a thousand years ago. The new result increases the confidence that the historic SN 1054 was an electron-capture supernova. It also explains why that supernova was relatively bright compared to the models: Its luminosity was probably artificially enhanced by the supernova ejecta colliding with material cast off by the progenitor star as was seen in SN 2018zd. Ken Nomoto at the Kavli IPMU of the University of Tokyo expressed excitement that his theory had been confirmed. "I am very pleased that the electron-capture supernova was finally discovered, which my colleagues and I predicted to exist and have a connection to the Crab Nebula 40 years ago," he said. "I very much appreciate the great efforts involved in obtaining these observations. This is a wonderful case of the combination of observations and theory."Hiramatsu added, "It was such a 'Eureka moment' for all of us that we can contribute to closing the 40-year-old theoretical loop, and for me personally because my career in astronomy started when I looked at the stunning pictures of the Universe in the high school library, one of which was the iconic Crab Nebula taken by the Hubble Space Telescope." "The term Rosetta Stone is used too often as an analogy when we find a new astrophysical object," said Andrew Howell, a staff scientist at Las Cumbres Observatory and adjunct faculty at UCSB, "but in this case I think it is fitting. This supernova is literally helping us decode thousand-year-old records from cultures all over the world. And it is helping us associate one thing we don't fully understand, the Crab Nebula, with another thing we have incredible modern records of, this supernova. In the process it is teaching us about fundamental physics: how some neutron stars get made, how extreme stars live and die, and about how the elements we're made of get created and scattered around the universe." Howell also is the leader of the Global Supernova Project, and lead author Hiramatsu 's Ph.D. advisor.

Scientists detect signatures of life remotely!



It could be a milestone on the path to detecting life on other planetS: Scientists under the leadership of the University of Bern and of the National Centre of Competence in Research (NCCR) Planets detect a key molecular property of all living organisms from a helicopter flying several kilometers above ground. The measurement technology could also open up opportunities for remote sensing of the Earth. Left hands and right hands are almost perfect mirror images of each other. But whatever way they are twisted and turned, they cannot be superimposed onto each other. This is why the left glove simply won't fit the right hand as well as it fits the left. In science, this property is referred to as chirality. Just like hands are chiral, molecules can be chiral, too. In fact, most molecules in the cells of living organisms, such as DNA, are chiral. Unlike hands, however, that usually come in pairs of left and right, the molecules of life almost exclusively occur in either their "left-handed" or their "right-handed" version. They are homochiral, as researchers say. Why that is, is still not clear. But this molecular homochirality is a characteristic property of life, a socalled biosignature. As part of the MERMOZ project, an international team led by the University of Bern and the National Centre of Competence in Research NCCR PlanetS, has now succeeded in detecting this signature from a distance of 2 kilometers and at a

velocity of 70 kph. Jonas Kühn, MERMOZ project manager of the University of Bern and co-author of the study that has just been published in the journal *Astronomy and Astrophysics*, says: "The significant advance is that these measurements have been performed in a platform that was moving, vibrating and that we still detected these biosignatures in a matter of seconds."

An instrument that recognizes living matter: "When light is reflected by biological matter, a part of the light's electromagnetic waves will travel in

either clockwise or counterclockwise spirals. This phenomenon is called circular polarization and is caused by the biological matter's homochirality. Similar spirals of light are not produced by abiotic non-living nature," says the first author of the study Lucas Patty, who is a MERMOZ postdoctoral researcher at the University of Bern and member of the NCCR PlanetS,

Measuring this circular polarization, however, is challenging. The signal is quite faint and typically makes up less than one percent of the light that is reflected. To measure it, the team developed a dedicated device called a spectropolarimeter. It consists of a camera equipped with special lenses and receivers capable of separating the circular polarization from the rest of the light.

Yet even with this elaborate device, the new results would have been impossible until recently. "Just 4 years ago, we could detect the signal only from a very close distance, around 20 cm, and needed to observe the same spot for several minutes to do so," as Lucas Patty recalls. But the upgrades to the instrument he and his colleagues made, allow a much faster and stable detection, and the strength of the signature in circular polarisation persists even with distance. This rendered the instrument fit for the first ever aerial circular polarization measurements.

Useful measurements on earth and in space: Using this upgraded instrument, dubbed FlyPol, they demonstrated that within mere seconds of measurements they could differentiate between grass fields, forests and urban areas from a fast moving helicopter. The measurements readily show living matter exhibiting the characteristic polarization signals, while roads, for example, do not show any significant circular polarization signals. With the current setup, they are even capable of detecting signals coming from algae in lakes.

After their successful tests, the scientists now look to go even further. "The next step we hope to take, is to perform similar detections from the International Space Station (ISS), looking down at the Earth. That will allow us to assess the detectability of planetary-scale biosignatures. This step will be decisive to enable the search for life in and beyond our Solar System using polarization," says MERMOZ principal investigator and co-author Brice-Olivier Demory, professor of astrophysics at the University of Bern and member of the NCCR PlanetS says. The sensitive observation of these circular polarization signals is not only important for future life detection missions. Lucas Patty explains: "Because the signal directly relates to the molecular composition of life and thus its functioning, it can also offer valuable complementary information in Earth remote sensing." It can for instance provide information about deforestation or plant disease. It might even be possible to implement circular polarization in the monitoring of toxic algal blooms, of coral reefs and the effects of acidification thereon.


